### **GSS** - purpose

To meet the needs of the government, business, and people of the UK for trusted, authoritative, relevant, and timely statistics, analysis and advice

### **CHARACTERISTICS**

## 7000 staff in approx 40 departments and agencies – 1200 professionals

- common structure across departments
- common recruitment process
- common competencies/professional standards
- wide geographic coverage across UK
- mobility

### **GRADING STRUCTURE**

- National Statistician = Permanent Sec
- [Director General]
- Director = Directorate/Group
- Chief Statistician = Division
- Senior Statistician
- Statistician = Branch
- Assistant Statistician/Statistical Officer

#### **MODELS of ORGANISATION**

### Models vary between and within departments

- Statistical Directorate = 4/5 Divisions
- Statistical Division within Policy or Analytical Directorate
- Statistical Branch within Policy Division
- Out-bedded statistician within policy branch

### RECRUITMENT

### Common system for all departments

- Assistant Statisticians
  - Fast stream
  - -20/30 per year
- Statistical Officers
  - -70/80 per year
- Ist class or upper 2nd honours degree
