

The Classification of individual consumption by purpose (COICOP) is used to classify both individual consumption expenditure and actual individual consumption. The latter is derived from the former by adding social reansfers in kind as shown in table 18.1.

The classification of the purposes of non-profit institutions serving households (COPNI) covers the same range of transactions as the classification of the functions of government (COFOG, SNA 18.2), i.e., current transactions, capital outlays and acquisition of certain financial assets.
