1 Timeline of the Reform Process

2004 Start - Committee was established

2006 Decision to Revise the Statistics Act

2007 Legislation - New Statistics Act (May)

Statistics Commission (October)

2008 Draft "Basic Plan" (October)

2009 Full Implementation (April)

2 Statistical Reform - Before and After (1)

(1) Clearer Principles

Before:

Too abstract, goals not clear enough.

After:

In line with UN Fundamental Principles Official statistics:

Foundation of rational decision-making for the public
 → Stronger Emphasis on Users' Perspective

(2) Wider Scope

Before:

Only censuses and surveys are covered.

Non-survey statistics are out of scope of the act.

After:

All statistics regardless of sources are covered.

National accounts statistics are included in the scope.

2 Statistical Reform - Before and After (2)

(3) More Effective Governance and Coordination Before:

Advisory body with limited authority - Statistics Council Passive coordination - scrutiny of the survey plans After:

Advisory body with broader authority - Statistics Commission Planning and active coordination – "Basic Plan", Follow-up

(4) Administrative Data as Data Sources Before:

No provision for access to administrative data After:

Authority to "request" access to administrative data

2 Statistical Reform - Before and After (3)

(5) Integration through Common Frame Before:

No provision on the common frame After:

Provisions for the "Establishment Database" i.e. Business Survey Frame

(6) Basis for Microdata

Before:

Strong restrictions to use of microdata

Mandatory publishing of "designated" statistics,
but no provision for wide dissemination

After:

Clear legal basis for use of anonymized microdata
