1) Survey classification by the Retail Price Survey(RPS)

Blank : Surveyed in all sample municipalities

1) : Surveyed in sample cities with population of 50,000 or more

2) : Surveyed in sample cities with population of 150,000 or more

4) : Surveyed in appropriate areas in each prefecture

2) Characteristics of items surveyed by the RPS

A : Items which consumers purchase mainly at their neighbouring areas, and the prices differ among areas

B : Items which are usually sold at representative commercial areas and large retail stores, and the prices differ among outlets

C : Items whose price differences are comparatively small among areas or outlets

D : Items of a single price or negligible price differences within the municipality or the prefecture

E : Items of a single price throughout the country or the region

S : Items whose prices are surveyed at any place of the municipality without fixing survey districts

House rent : House rent of household living in rented house

POS : Items which are calculated using prices collected from the POS information data

WS : Items which are calculated using prices collected by the web scraping technology

3) Frequency of price survey by the RPS (Trend Survey)

* : Three times a month (every 10-days in a month)

Blank : Once, in the middle of the month

4) Method of price substitution, if not surveyed

Blank : Price substitutions are not performed.

A : Classification by survey area 3) ; Prices of cities with prefectural government are substituted for the unobserved prices of all sample municipalities in each prefecture.

B : Classification by survey area 2) ; Prices of neighboring cities with population of 150,000 or more are substituted for the unobserved prices of sample cities with population of less than 150,000, sample towns and villages.

C : Classification by survey area 1) ; Prices of neighboring cities with population of 50,000 or more are substituted for the unobserved prices of sample cities with population of less than 50,000, sample towns and villages.

G : Single price throughout Japan is substituted for all municipalities except in Okinawa prefecture.

For municipalities on Okinawa Main Island and on remote islands, the prices of Naha City or Miyakojima City, respectively, are substituted.

H : For Trend Survey cities, prices of designated cities are substituted according to the commuting area.

For Structural Survey cities, the prefectural weighted average is substituted.

K : Prices surveyed throughout each prefecture (with the prefectural capital city code assigned as the municipality code) are substituted for all municipalities within the prefecture.

For prefectures where the relevant school is not available, prices of neighboring prefectures are substituted according to the commuting area.

L : Prices surveyed throughout each prefecture (with the prefectural capital city code assigned as the municipality code) are substituted for all municipalities within the prefecture.

For prefectures where the relevant school is not available, prices of neighboring prefectures are substituted according to the commuting area.

M : Prices surveyed throughout each prefecture (with the prefectural capital city code assigned as the municipality code) are substituted for all municipalities within the prefecture.

For prefectures where the relevant school is not available, prices of neighboring prefectures are substituted according to the commuting area.

N : Prices of appropriate areas in each prefecture are substituted for all sample municipalities in the prefecture.

O : Single price throughout Japan is substituted for all sample municipalities.

R : Same as classification N. For Shiga Prefecture, the price of Kyoto City is substituted.

S : For Trend Survey cities, no price substitution is performed. For Structural Survey cities, prices of neighboring Trend Survey cities are substituted.

U : For Trend Survey cities, same as C. For Structural Survey cities, no price substitution is performed.
