<News Highlights>

Tabulation on Internal Migration for Population of the 2020 Population Census of Japan Released

On February 28, 2022, the Tabulation on Internal Migration for Population of the 2020 Population Census of Japan was released.

Based on the results of the complete count of questionnaires, the tabulation includes the status of internal migration for population by sex and age comparing the usual place of residence at the time of the 2015 Population Census (place of usual residence five years ago) with the usual place of residence at the time of the 2020 Population Census.

[Overview]

- Looking at usual residents (“persons usually live”, the population based on current address of residence) by the place where they lived five years before, those who lived in a place other than their current address (hereinafter, “migration”) numbered 28,672 thousand (22.7%). Thus, 20 percent of usual residents have changed address in the last five years.
- The rate of migration to population by age (in five-year groups) was the highest at 56.6% for those aged 25 to 29, followed by 30 to 34 (53.8%) and 20 to 24 (44.1%).
- With regard to the excess inward migration rate, Tokyo-to had the highest at 4.5%, followed by Chiba-ken (1.7%) and Fukuoka-ken (1.5%).
- Aomori-ken had the highest excess outward migration rate at 2.5%, followed by Akita-ken (2.1%) and Nagasaki-ken (1.8%).

* The above figures are based on the results with imputation. "Imputation" is the method of proportionally distributing by unknown values.

“Consumer Price Index” (2020-base, Japan, January 2022)

- The consumer price index for Japan was 100.3 (2020=100), up 0.5% over the year before seasonal adjustment, and up 0.1% from the previous month on a seasonally adjusted basis.

Release | February 21, 2022

“Population Estimates” (Final estimates, September 1, 2021)

[Total Population]

- The total population was 125,559 thousand, a decrease of 628 thousand (0.50%) from the previous year.
- The population under 15 years old was 14,804 thousand, a decrease of 250 thousand (1.66%) from the previous year.
- The population aged 15 to 64 was 74, 555 thousand, a decrease of 575 thousand (0.77%) from the previous year.
- The population aged 65 and over was 36,201 thousand, an increase of 197 thousand (0.55%) from the previous year.

[Japanese Population]

- Japanese population was 122,834 thousand, a decrease of 603 thousand (0.49%) from the previous year.

“Population Estimates” (Provisional estimates, February 1, 2022)

[Total Population]

- The total population was 125.34 million, a decrease of 0.65 million (0.51%) from the previous year.

“Monthly Report on Internal Migration” (Japan, January 2022)

[All nationalities]

- The number of internal migrants was 326,360, an increase of 5,689 (1.8%) from the previous year.
- The number of inter-prefectural migrants was 148,045, an increase of 4,556 (3.2%) from the previous year.
- The number of intra-prefectural migrants was 178,315, an increase of 1,133 (0.6%) from the previous year.

[Japanese]

- The number of internal migrants was 298,411, an increase of 16,492 (5.8%) from the previous year.
- The number of inter-prefectural migrants was 132,563, an increase of 10,475 (8.6%) from the previous year.
- The number of intra-prefectural migrants was 165,848, an increase of 6,017 (3.8%) from the previous year.

“Consumer Price Index” (Preliminary, 2020-base, Ku-area of Tokyo, February 2022)

- The consumer price index for Ku-area of Tokyo (preliminary) was 100.7 (2020=100), up 1.0% over the year before seasonal adjustment, and up 0.5% from the previous month on a seasonally adjusted basis.

Release | February 28, 2022

“Monthly Survey on Service Industries” (Preliminary, December 2021)

- Monthly sales: 33.6 trillion yen, up 1.9% over the year.
- Number of persons working at the location of establishment: 29.24 million persons, down 1.0% over the year.

Release | March 4, 2022

“Labour Force Survey” (Basic Tabulation, January 2022)

- The number of employed persons was 66.46 million, a decrease of 0.32 million from the previous year.
- The number of unemployed persons was 1.85 million, a decrease of 0.14 million from the

previous year.

- The unemployment rate, seasonally adjusted, was 2.8%.

“Family Income and Expenditure Survey” (Two-or-more-person Households, January 2022)

[Expenditures for Two-or-more-person Households]

- The average of monthly consumption expenditures per household was 287,801 yen, up 7.5% in nominal terms and up 6.9% in real terms from the previous year.

[Income and Expenditures for Workers’ Households]

- The average of monthly income per household stood at 479,805 yen, up 2.2% in nominal terms and up 1.6% in real terms from the previous year.
- The average of consumption expenditures per household was 314,358 yen, up 5.6% in nominal terms and up 5.0% in real terms from the previous year.

“Survey of Household Economy” (Two-or-more-person Households, January 2022)

- Change over the year of monthly expenditure on goods and services ordered over the internet
[Average expenditure on goods and services ordered over the internet]

- Average expenditure on goods and services ordered over the internet was 19,509 yen (up 15.3% in nominal terms).

[Main items contributed to the change of average expenditure on goods and services ordered over the internet]

- Travel-related costs: up 139.7% in nominal terms
- Food: up 24.1% in nominal terms
- Tickets: up 125.0% in nominal terms
- Clothing, footwear: up 7.6% in nominal terms
