According to Table 4.4, both males and females who have never attended decreased the percent: 30% to 21% for males versus 35% to 20% for females, during 1998-2008. The employed persons aged 10 to 14 who attended in the past increased the percents among males and females: 36% to 54% for males versus 41% to 58% for females. Although a gender gap about status of school attendance for employed persons still exists, the gap has been narrowing.

4.5 SCHOOL ATTENDANCE BY URBAN AND RURAL AREAS

Rural dwellers have shown the remarkable rise of attendance rates for persons aged 6-9 and 10-14 (Table 4.5). However, the rural dwellers have still lower attendance rate than the urban dwellers. The attendance rates for persons aged 10-14 in rural area rose from 71.7% to 86.8%, an increase by about 15%, while those in urban area rose from 82.5% to 91.9%, an increase by 9% during 1998-2008. The difference of the attendance rate between males and females is still higher in rural area than in urban area.

Figure 4.4 indicates the school attendance rate by single year of age and urban and rural areas. The attendance rates at all ages 6-24 in urban area is higher than those in rural area both for 1998 and 2008. It is also true that rural dwellers have shown the remarkable rise of attendance rates for persons by single year of age.



The urban/rural differentials between full time students and employed students are shown in Table 4.6. The proportions of full time students ages 5-19 in urban area are

greater than those in rural area.

Table 4.7 indicates the school attendance status of employed persons by urban and rural areas. The employed persons who have never attended decreased the proportions: 25% to 9% in urban area and 33% to 22% in rural area during 1998-2008. The gap of attendance status among employed persons between urban and rural areas still exists, however the gap has been narrowing.

In 2008, Takaev has the highest percentage of persons aged 6 and over who are attending (33%), followed by Krong Kaeb, Kampot and Svay Rieng. On the other hand Ratanak Kiri has the lowest percentage of them (18%), followed by Krong Pailin located near from the border. Phnom Penh had the highest attendance rate in 1998 (32%), however the rate dropped to 29% in 2008. The school attendance rate rose in
