
40.2 % for "10-19", and 6.7 % for "20 years or more". Between 1998 and 2008, the proportions of migrants of "1-4 years" and of "5-9 years" increased, while those of other groups of duration of residence decreased. Figure 1.1 shows the same pattern of change in proportions of migrants by duration of residence for internal migration (within Cambodia) as recognized for total migrants between 1998 and 2008.

Change in residence for staying of "5-9 years" or more may not always be enumerated accurately due to being beyond recollection. Also, information on change in residence for staying of "5-9 years" or more is not necessarily helpful to policy formulation. So that, in this report, the analysis to be described below is made mainly on the basis of the data of the migration during the period less than 1 year, or "**current**" migration and of the migration during the period less than 5 year, or "**recent**" migration.

Observing Table 1.8, the proportions of "less than 1 year", or current migration by place of last residence became smaller in 2008 than in 1998. On the contrary, those of "1-4 years" and "less than 5 years", or recent migration became larger in 2008 than in 1998. On the other hand, the proportions of the migrants of "same district" or "within same district", "other district" or "between districts" and "outside Cambodia" decreased respectively, whereas the proportion of "other province" or "between provinces" increased remarkably, during the decade from 1998 to 2008. Based on Table 1.8, Table 1.9 can be prepared for analyses on period-migration. In this table, difference in five types of migration flows can be recognized in Cambodia. Also, it is known that the volume and mobility of spatial migration decreases according to increase in size of spatial unit.

1.3.1.2 International Period-Migration

Table 1.8 and Figure.1.4 presents the proportions of migrants by duration of residence

for international migration (outside Cambodia) for 1998 and 2008. According to this figure, international in-migration to Cambodia was weakened not only in the migrants of less than one year in last residence, or current migration but also in those of 1-4 years, or recent migration during the decade. Also, it is known that volume of international in-migration is 21, 923 persons

in the case of recent migration and 8,246 persons in the case of current migration. Mobility measured by migration rate, number of migrants per 100 persons is 0.2 % for recent migration and 0.1 % for current migration.

1.3.2 Volume and Mobility of Period-Migration by Province

1.3.2.1 Volume of Period-Migration by Province

Table 1.10 shows number of "overall migrants" and "overall migration rates" by province. Exactly speaking, overall migrants are the migrants who correspond to all of the spatial units and correspond to all durations of last residence including those with undefined duration of last residence. However, for the purpose of explicit comparison, in this table, among the migrants who correspond to all of five types of inter-village, inter-district, inter-province, and international overall migrations, those as for all durations, recent and current migrations are presented.

In the respect of volume of migration, number of migrants in all durations is counted as 3,552,345 persons for national total as of 2008. Those persons are distributed to all provinces. The most (912,611 persons) are to Phnom Penh, national capital. Battanbang counted the second most (397,312 persons). Kandal, Kampong Cham, and Banteay Meanchey recorded about 200,000 persons respectively. Nine provinces recorded 100,000 to less than 200,000 persons. Other 10 provinces recorded less than 100,000 persons. Among them, Kep with 35,753 persons in total population marked 9,272 persons, or the least. (Table 1.11)
