4.3.4 'Secondary Economic Activity'

The population who aged 15-34 having economic activity as secondary is shown by Table 4.18. The number of the population who aged 15-24 having economic activity as secondary is 1 million, and that of the corresponding population who aged 25-34 is 0.9 million. Regardless of sex, the higher the proportion of youths who have economic activity as secondary is, the higher their age is. (See Chapter 3 for the concept of 'Secondary Economic Activity'.)

The positive relationship of economic activity with age is also observed in the population whose main activity is economic activity. However, in the population whose main activity is not economic activity, the proportion of youths who have economic activity as secondary activity falls, as age goes up. Students account for the largest proportion of the economically inactive youths who have an economic activity as secondary activity. The youths who are economically inactive have economic activity as secondary activity amount to 216 thousand, and out of this number 190 thousand are students (Table 4.19).



The proportion of youths having economic activity as secondary activity is 35.2 percent (Table 4.18). Nearly a half of employed youths has secondary job (46.9 percent). The proportion of the unemployed youth who has economic activity (32.3 percent) as secondary activity is lower than that of the employed youths, and that of economically inactive youths (18.2 percent) is lower than that of the unemployed.

The proportion of youths having economic activity as secondary activity has very large urban/rural difference. The same proportion in rural areas is 43.7 percent, while it is only 7.2 percent in urban area (Figure 4.13). The sector of employment for secondary economic activity performed by youths is dominated by agricultural sector, especially by 'Crop farming or livestock farming' (0.9 million out of 1 million youths). Most of them are unpaid work (over 0.8 million). Agricultural work is few in urban areas, so the proportion of youths who have economic activity as secondary activity is lower in urban areas.



4.3.5 Sub-national Difference in Economically Activity of Youths

The economically active rate of youths is different in areas. It is higher in rural areas than urban areas. The unemployment rate is higher in urban areas than in rural areas. As for the regional difference, the economically active rate of youths is the lowest in Phnom Penh (51.7 percent), followed by Coastal region (57.6 percent), and the highest in Tonle Sap region. (Table 4.20)

Provincial differences are larger than regional differences. While the economically active rates of youths in Mondul Kiri and Ratanak Kiri are over 70 percent (71.7 percent and 71.6 percent, respectively), Phnom Penh, Preah Sihanouk and Takeo are nearly 50 percent (51.7 percent, 52.0 percent and 53.0 percent, respectively). The gap between the highest and the lowest is 20 percentage points. The economic activity rate of youths in 16 provinces exceeded the national figure (60.1 percent).

In only three provinces the economic activity rate of male youths exceeds that of female youths. Those are Koh Kong, Battambang and Pailin. In every other province, the same rate of male youths is smaller than that of female youths. The biggest gender gap is seen in Takeo (13.1 percent points), followed by Kampong Speu (12.8 percent points) and Phnom Penh (12.2 percent points). In these provinces, there is a gender gap in school attendance, too (see Report 7 of literacy and education for detail).

The unemployment rate is higher in urban areas than rural areas. The unemployment rate by province ranges from 0.4 percent (Svay Rieng) to 9.0 percent (Phnom Penh). The unemployment rates in Phnom Penh, Pursat and Koh Kong exceed 5 percent (9.0 percent, 6.2 percent and 5.8 percent, respectively).
