

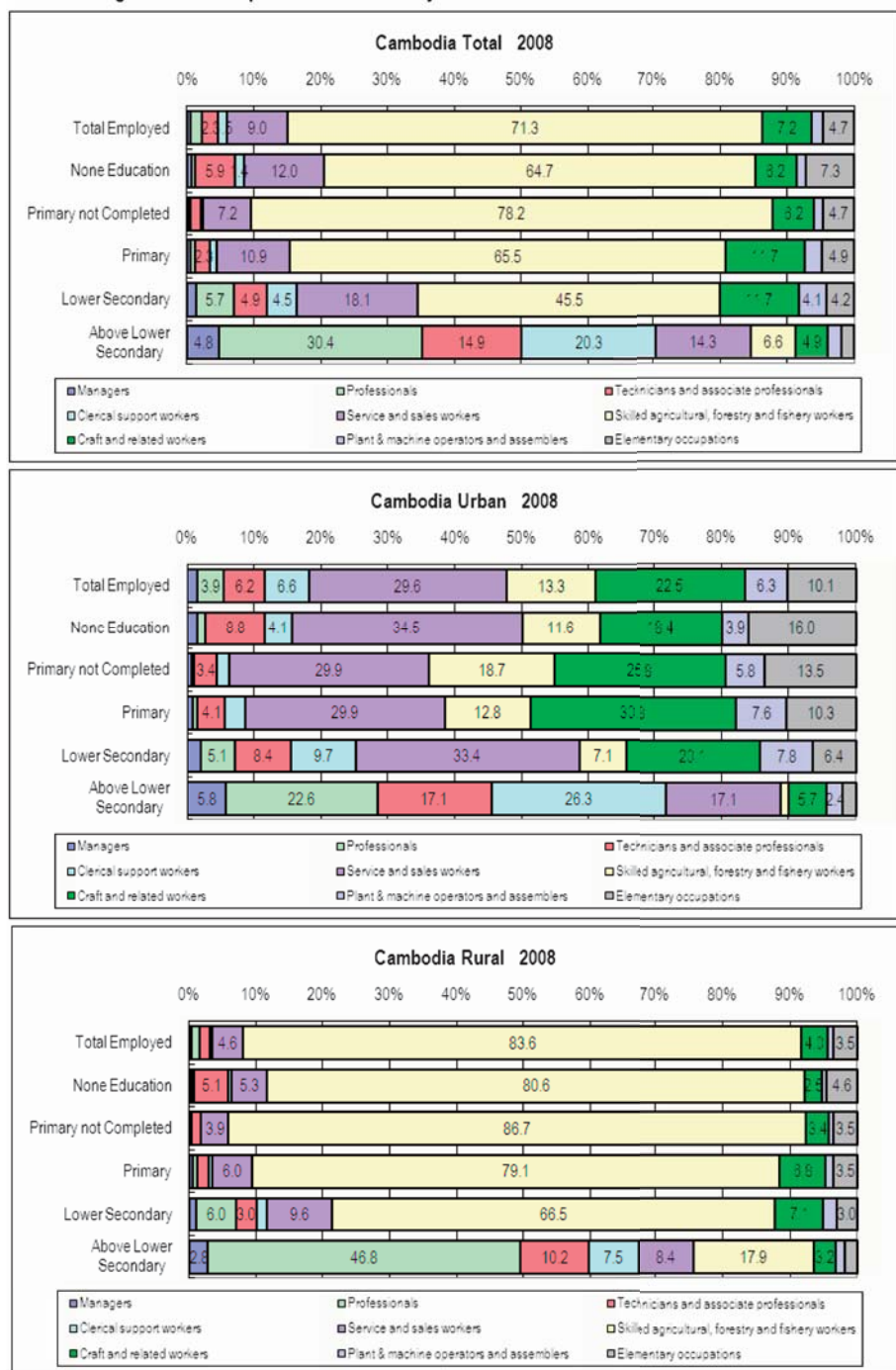

who qualified ‘Above Lower Secondary’ education in rural areas is higher than in urban areas (46.8 percent and 22.6 percent respectively), but the proportion for ‘Clerical support workers’ in rural areas is much lower than in urban areas (7.5 percent and 26.3 percent respectively). Furthermore, 17.9 percent of those who qualified for ‘Above Lower Secondary’ education in rural areas are engaged in the occupation of ‘Skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers’. It is likely that the population who attained higher education, which is ‘Above Lower Secondary’, in rural areas is not able to use their human resource effectively. (Figure 2.16)

As for sex difference, females have lower level of education than males. But females who have completed primary education have much opportunity to be ‘Craft and related workers’ or ‘Service and sales workers’

than the corresponding males (16.4 percent and 15.0 percent for female, 8.0 percent and 7.6 percent for male, respectively). (Figure 2.17)
